PATRON SAINT OF CHARITABLE ACTIVITIES

Next Monday, 27th September, is the Memorial of St Vincent de Paul, whose compassion and commitment were legendary even during his own lifetime. He was born in Pouy, France in 1581 and went to study at the University of Toulouse, becoming an ordained priest at the unusually early age of 19. He went to Rome for further studies, and returned to France as a court chaplain to Queen Margaret of Valois in Paris. It was at this time that he met St Francis De Sales and Pierre de Berulle who were working with the poor and oppressed and this interiorly converted him to dedicate his life to the care of the needy. He ministered to prisoners and the convicts in Bordeaux and in 1625 founded the Congregation of the Mission, the Vincentians, a community devoted to missionary work among the poor in towns and villages across France. In 1633, the Vincentians were given the church of St Lazare in Paris and in the same year Vincent founded the Sisters of Charity with Louise the Marillac, an unenclosed congregation of women ministering to the poor and sick, the first of its kind and extremely successful. He founded countless hospitals and orphanages, gave aid to victims of war, sent missionaries abroad, ransomed enslaved Christians in North Africa, established new highquality, seminaries and wrote many spiritual works. His deepest concern was the practical relief of human suffering and his charismatic selfishness inspired many from all walks of life to join his work. He died on the 27th September 1660 and was canonised by Pope Clement XII in 1730. In 1830, a lay confraternity called the Society of St Vincent de Paul ("the SVP") was founded by Frederick Ozanam, the widespread dissemination of which did much to further the cult of St Vincent de Paul. In 1885, Pope Leo XII named him patron of all charitable groups. Next Monday, let's especially pray for and support the SVP groups across the Diocese, enlisting the prayers of St Vincent for all the needy, especially those who are served by Caritas Diocese of Portsmouth.

SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST WENCESLAUS - 28TH SEPTEMBER

We all sing about "Good King Wenceslaus" at Christmas, but who was he? At the time of his death, he wasn't a king, only a duke, however, the Holy Roman Emperor, Otto I conferred the title "king" soon after his death.

Wenceslaus, also known as Vaclav, was born around the year 907 in a castle near Prague, in what is now the Czech Republic.

His mother was a pagan, and it was his grandmother, St Ludmilla, who taught him about religion. He practised the Faith and received the Sacraments in secret.

St Wenceslaus had a strong devotion to the Blessed Sacrament and would make the bread and wine from wheat and grapes that he had grown himself.

He faced many trials in governing as a Christian prince, many were from his own brother, Boleslav who instigated his murder on 27th September 929.

A reconciliation with his family was attempted when they gathered at a banquet to celebrate the feast of Ss Cosmas and Damien. The next morning, his brother killed him with a lance on the steps of the church. Wenceslaus was just 22 years old. According to legend, his last words were "brother, may God forgive you". Many miracles were attributed to him soon after his death. The mortal remains of St Wenceslaus are in St Vitus Cathedral in Prague.

The words of the popular carol "Good King Wenceslaus" were written in 1853, but the melody is much older than that. It's a 13th Century tune called "Tempus adest floridum" - the time for the flowers has come - in other words, springtime.

St Stephen's Day (Boxing Day) was traditionally the day for charitable almsgiving. St Wenceslaus, on this day, would go out at night despite the snow being "deep and crisp and even", to distribute alms to the poor, especially to widows and orphans and those experiencing hardship.

His feast day is a national holiday in the Czech Republic where he is, of course, their patron saint. *St Wensceslaus - pray for us.* Mike Tomas
