## **TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – 3<sup>RD</sup> OCTOBER 2021**

Dear Parishioners,

In accordance with latest guidelines\* the following changes were agreed at the Co-ordinating Team meeting last Wednesday, and will take effect from Friday, 1<sup>st</sup> October.

**Public Mass Times:** Tuesday 12 noon, Wednesday 12 noon. Thursday 9.30 am (with one class from St Paul's school), Friday 7 pm, Saturday 10 am, followed by Rosary, Sunday Mass: Saturday, 5 pm Vigil, Sunday 8.30 am, Sunday **10.30 am. \*\***Livestream: Sunday 10.30 am, and special events only\*\*. **Confessions:** Saturdays 9.30 am, and on request.

All are welcome to attend any Mass, and we will no longer keep a record of who attends. No booking or invitations are required. Fr Peter encourages everyone to continue to wear **face coverings, sanitise** their hands and maintain a sensible distance from others. Please use common sense and respect for others.

All pews will be available except on the far-left side, where every second pew will remain roped off, to maintain some socially distanced seating, i.e. one family group or a maximum of one couple and one single person per pew as now. In all other pews, please leave a sensible space between you and other people/groups.

**Communion:** For a few weeks, the welcomers will continue to guide the flow of people when going up to communion in order to establish a routine. Fr Peter also asks those who wish to receive on the tongue to wait and come up last please. Fr Peter will wear a mask when giving communion.

**Dismissal:** People will no longer be dismissed row by row through the Fire Exit, but can choose to leave via the porch or Fire Exit, keeping a sensible distance from others. Please do not gather in the porch or immediately outside – move further away into the car park, if you would like to have a chat.

**Ventilation** is very important, and windows will be open as much as possible, as well as doors when the weather is mild. Please dress appropriately.

Welcomers will continue to greet people as they arrive and to be available for advice.
Sign of Peace: No physical contact; simply nod or bow to each other.
Singing is now allowed again. We will put words up on the screen very soon, so you can join in.
Cleaning: The church will return to being cleaned just once a week.
Parish Office: Open to visitors, but please wear face covering if you can.
Crying Room can be used, but be aware that it is poorly ventilated; the door to porch should remain open.

Sunday Obligation is expected to start again at the start of Advent

#### SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST BRUNO – 6<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER

On Wednesday this week, we celebrate the optional memorial of St Bruno, founder of the Carthusian Order of monks and nuns.

St Bruno was born in Cologne in 1035 and taught theology in Rheims (France).

In 1084, he had a 'get-away from it all' moment and, with six companions, retired to the mountains near Grenoble (France), and founded the very strict monastery of the Grande Chartreuse.

The purpose of the Carthusian is total withdrawal from the world to serve God by personal devotion and privation.

I have an old school friend who is a Carthusian monk. He, like other monks, lives in isolation in what is known as a cell (in effect a small, private monastery) with his own private garden where they work on a variety of jobs.

Apart from Sundays, feast days and funerals when they celebrate Mass and the Office together, Carthusians will say Mass and prayers alone in their cells.

Carthusians do not eat meat and their diet consists mainly of fish, pulses, eggs and homegrown vegetables. Each cell has a serving hatch through which their food is passed.

In a Carthusian monastery, you will not find television, mobile phones or radios - you will find newspapers, but only Catholic ones.

Once a year, a monk can invite family members to visit him, but accommodation must be found outside the monastery. Men can enter the monastery but women cannot.

There is one Carthusian monastery in England, St Hughs in Cowfold, West Sussex. In January of this year, it housed twenty one monks.

Carthusians are famous for their famous liqueur, Chartreuse, which they first started making in 1737. The recipe is a closely guarded secret: only two monks at any one time may know the recipe.

St Bruno died in Calabria (the toe of the boot of Italy) on 6th October 1101, and was canonized in 1514. *St Bruno - pray for us.* Mike Tomas.
