TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – 17TH OCTOBER 2021

Today is 29th Sunday of the Year and the Gospel is Mark 10:35-45. In the Christian life, we quickly find that everything is upside down: the rich are poor and the poor are rich, the masters are slaves and the slaves masters, the first are last and the last, first. In fact, Jesus himself is the first one who made himself 'upside down' for us. Being God, he became man. Being rich, he became poor. Being Lord, he became servant. Being Life, he suffered death. Now he teaches his disciples James and John – and all of us – to do the same. This is the logic of love, the logic of God who gives himself to us and has come to serve us.

SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST PAUL OF THE CROSS – 19TH OCTOBER

St Paul of the Cross (Paolo Francesco Danei) was born near Genoa, [about 312 miles northwest of Rome] in 1694. On Tuesday, we celebrate the optional memorial of him, the founder of the Passionists, an order centred on the Cross and Passion of Christ.

He came from a very devout family, and, at an early age, committed himself to a life of religion and austerity. Paolo renounced the chance of both marriage and inheriting a vast family fortune. He prayed for guidance as to which direction his religious zeal should lead him. In 1720, Paolo received a vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary wearing a black habit with the name of Jesus and a cross in white. She told him to found an order whose purpose was to focus on Christ's passion. The Order still wears the same habit today.

Paolo went to Rome to seek approval for his new Order; it was initially rejected, but later approved. He had a special interest in England and regularly prayed for its conversion. Blessed Dominic Barbari, who received St John Henry Newman into the Church, was a Passionist [Blessed Dominic died in Reading in 1849]. On his deathbed, Paolo urged his followers to remember the words of Jesus: "by this all men know that you are my disciples, that you have love one for another". He died in 1775 and was canonized in 1867 by Pope Pius IX. St Paul of the Cross - pray for us.

NEWS FROM BAMENDA

Jo Overton, Chair of our Bamenda-Portsmouth Committee brings us the latest update from our twin diocese......

Three or four years ago, Bamenda Committee members were happily reviewing progress made on our collaborative project for a new health centre at Bamessing. The community greeted us warmly and welcomed us in to the first phase building which was already operating with a few dedicated staff. It is all the more shocking therefore to hear that last month government forces killed four separatists in the main town of Bamenda and that separatist fighters subsequently launched a combined IED and rocket-propelled grenade attack on an army convoy in Bamessing village which killed 15 elite army unit soldiers. Around the same time a three-week lockdown was announced by a faction of the separatist movement and people were prohibited from going about their normal daily lives. This is the reality that our brothers and sisters are living with in our twin Archdiocese. As we approach Bamenda Sunday, please keep them in your prayers and raise your own and others' awareness of this neglected conflict.
