# SAINT OF THE WEEK: <u>SS CHAD & CEDD, BISHOPS – 26<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER</u>

We all know that boundary lines have to be drawn somewhere, but did you know that you could go to the Channel Islands and not leave the Diocese but travel the short distance to Caversham and be in a different one? I mention this because Our Lady and St Anne's, approximately five miles from St Joseph's, is in Birmingham Diocese, whose Cathedral is dedicated to St Chad.

St Chad, who together with his brother St Cedd (pronounced Ce ed h) is the optional memorial we celebrate on Tuesday.

These two brothers were monks of Lindisfarne [a beautiful island off the coast of Northumberland]. Both became bishops in the 7th century. Cedd founded an abbey in Lastingham, North Yorkshire. Chad later succeeded him as Abbot of Lastingham, and later became the Archbishop of York.

However, Chad had a dispute with Theodore (later Saint Theodore) the Archbishop of Canterbury, and was removed from York but allowed to continue his episcopate in Lichfield in the West Midlands.

St Cedd, who died in 664, is the patron saint of Essex, having founded a monastery there. St Chad, according to the Oxford English Dictionary, is the patron saint of disputed elections having survived controversy over his own election as Bishop, he died in 672.

Relics of St Chad are now preserved in St Chad's Cathedral in Birmingham, the first Catholic Cathedral erected in this country after the Reformation. *Saint Chad & Saint Cedd - pray for us.* Mike Tomas
