EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – 1ST AUGUST 2021

As mentioned last week, there will be no drastic changes to the current Covid procedures in operation here at St Joseph's; we remain in line with the English Martyrs parish. While COVID cases remain high locally, we will continue with our existing system. Restrictions will be reviewed every few weeks.

We ask everyone to continue to wear a face-covering. The weekend Mass invitation system, sanitizing and social distancing will all continue for the time being. We have a responsibility to keep each other safe, especially the vulnerable. We have added a few more pews, and we are hopeful that most people will be offered a place at one of the weekend Masses every week, especially as it is holiday time.

The Co-ordinating Team is reforming. The key focus points for the team initially will be to provide support for the parish while Fr Peter is away, and to gradually manage changes as a result of COVID restrictions easing on 19^{th} July. If you have questions or suggestions for the team to discuss, please submit them to the Parish Office.

The Catholic Bishops of England and Wales released new guidance recently. We have already agreed a few small changes and will continue to review other aspects. We agreed it is no longer necessary to clean the church if it will not be used again for 2 days. So, it will not be cleaned after Wednesday midday Mass, and after Sunday 11 am Mass. We will also look at offering confessions again after some Masses. Please continue to read the weekly newsletter for further updates.

'Public Consultation - Reading Borough Council -Bereavement Services including Cemeteries and **Crematorium.** We would like to bring to your attention details of a new public consultation on the Bereavement Services provided by the Council and would greatly appreciate your assistance in raising awareness of this within your parish community. We know this can be a difficult subject to think and talk about, but everyone's opinion is very important to us. Under the Local Authorities' Cemeteries Order 1977 (LACO) legislation, Local Authorities are required to prepare and adopt Cemetery Regulations that set out the Council's policy and procedures for the operation of the cemetery. The last time the cemetery regulations were updated and adopted by the Council was in 2011. The Regulation's apply to Henley Road Cemetery, Reading Cemetery and Caversham Cemetery only. They also apply to Reading Crematorium and Gardens of Remembrance based at Henley Road Cemetery. The Council is committed to ensuring that our bereavement services meet the needs of all our communities. In 2010, we adopted the Charter for the Bereaved, which sets out a best practice model for cemeteries operations and an inclusive service provision for people of all faiths or non-faith. We work to this Charter wherever possible. On that basis, a full review of the current burials services and cemetery operations has been carried out. The aim being, to enhance the Service and meet more of the needs of our culturally diverse community. The review includes:

- 1. Amendments to the Cemetery Rules and Regulations
- 2. The grave types and memorial options available
- 3. Opening hours and resources
- 4. Accessibility on site.

It is intended all residents of Reading Borough and their families could benefit from the draft proposals. The Consultation on the draft proposals commenced Monday, 28th June 2021, and we are seeking views from a wide range of customers and community groups, as well as existing grave owners. The consultation period will last for 45 days. Once the consultation is over, a final draft of the proposed regulations, taking account of consultation responses received, will be considered by the Councils Policy Committee in September. ST JOHN VIANNEY – 4TH AUGUST

"There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, He would have given it to us".

This is a famous quotation of St John Vianney whose memorial we keep on Wednesday.

John was born on 8th May 1786 in Dardilly near Lyons (about 290 miles southeast of Paris), and was baptized the same day. He grew up during the French Revolution when priests were forced to work in secrecy or face execution. To the young John, priests were heroes and their bravery and devotion may have inspired him to become a priest himself.

John received his First Holy Communion catechism in private from nuns who lost their convents during the Revolution.

John found his seminary studies difficult (especially Latin). Nevertheless, he persevered and was eventually ordained. After three years as an assistant priest, he was sent to a town named Ars (about 270 miles southwest of Paris) where he remained for 42 years.

When he arrived, Fr Vianney realised that many of his congregation were either ignorant or indifferent to religion as a result of the French Revolution. Despite encountering much opposition, he reformed the parish and was renowned for spending up to twelve hours a day every day in the confessional.

His fame spread far and wide and it is said that up to 20,000 pilgrims visited him each year. He was known as the Curé of Ars (Curé means parish priest).

He died on 4th August 1859 and was canonized in 1925. He is the patron saint of parish clergy. Let us pray for our priests on this day.

When our church was dedicated in 2003, a relic of St John Vianney was placed in the altar. *St John Vianney - pray for us.* Mike Tomas.
