FIFTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME - 11TH JULY 2021

TODAY is the Fifteenth Sunday of the Year. In the Gospel (Mark 6:7-13) we hear how Jesus entrusts to the twelve apostles the work that, until now, he had Himself performed: proclaiming the Kingdom of God, casting our demons, healing the sick. Today, that same work is carried out by the Church, founded on the teaching and preaching of the Apostles in obedience to Christ's command. Does the apostolic work have anything to do with me, or do I feel unconcerned by the mandate of Jesus? Is it only the work of bishops and priests to proclaim the kingdom in words and deeds, to fight evil, and to relieve suffering? How can I take my part in the mission of the Church, in concrete ways, in my own time, place and circumstances?

WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY

The Holy Father has designated 25th July as the first World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. The Vatican Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life have produced a selection of resources for the Day, so as to ensure that "its joyous message reaches every grandparent and elderly person effectively, even the most isolated." You can access the message of Pope Francis here and also some pastoral guidelines and ideas for the day here The Vatican suggests that it "would be especially meaningful if, as the Day approaches, the message could be delivered by every grandchild to their own grandparents, and by young people to the lonely elderly members of their communities". To mark the day and to encourage acts of charity, the Holy Father has established a special Plenary Indulgence for those who on that day devote adequate time to actually or virtually visiting their elderly brothers and sisters in need or in difficulty (such as the sick, the abandoned, the disabled and other similar cases).

SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST BONAVENTURE (1221 - 1274)

On Thursday, we celebrate the memorial of St Bonaventure, Bishop and Doctor. Bonaventure was born in 1221 in Bagnoregio (about 75 miles north of Rome). However, he was baptised "John" and received the name "Bonaventure" as a consequence of an exclamation of St Francis of Assisi. As a child, John had a very dangerous illness. At the pleading of his mother, St Francis prayed for the boy's recovery. St Francis, foreseeing the future greatness of this child, cried out, "O Buona ventura" (O good fortune), and the name stuck. Bonaventure made a full recovery.

Aged twenty-two, Bonaventure entered the Franciscan Order and was sent to Paris to complete his studies. It was there that he became good friends with St Thomas Aquinas, and they both received their Doctorates there. When he was thirty-five, Bonaventure was made General of his Order and restored calm where peace had been disturbed by internal dissensions.

In 1265, he was nominated by Pope Clement IV to be the next Archbishop of York, but begged not to be forced to accept that role. Bonaventure was later made Cardinal Bishop of Albano (Rome), and was assisting at the Second Council of Lyons when he died on 15th July 1274. He was canonized in 1482 and made a Doctor of the Church in 1588. He is remembered chiefly for his philosophical and theological works and is known as the" Seraphic [angelic] Doctor".

A famous quotation of his reads: ``In all your deeds and words, you should look upon this Jesus as your model. Do so, whether you are keeping silence or speaking, whether you are alone or with others. He is perfect and thus you will be, not only irreprehensible, but praiseworthy.

Bonaventure is the patron saint of those suffering from bowel disorders because it was this condition which nearly took his life as a child. *St Bonaventure - pray for us.* Mike Tomas.

RIGHT TO LIFE UK

Ask your MP to vote against abortion up to birth. The abortion lobby, led by the UK's largest abortion provider, BPAS, has worked with Diana Johnson MP to bring forward an amendment to hijack the Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Bill to introduce abortion on demand, for any reason, up to birth to England and Wales. This would be the single biggest change to abortion legislation since 1967 and would leave England and Wales with one of the most extreme abortion laws in the world.
