## **DAY OF PRAYER FOR VICTIMS AND SURVIVORS**

Tuesday, 4th May is to be this year's Day of Prayer for the Victims and Survivors of Abuse. Listening to the voices of victims and survivors, the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales have moved the date on which the Day of Prayer for the Victims and Survivors of Abuse is usually marked, to a new date during the Easter Season. Initially, the Fifth Friday in Lent, it was felt that the inclusion of this day in Lent was penitential. The original motivation for the day was not the Church seeking forgiveness for its failings, but on the hope and renewal that is necessary for the victims, survivors and others affected by abuse (for example families, parish communities). As such, the Conference decided to move this Day of Prayer for Victims and Survivors of Abuse to the Tuesday of the Fifth Week of Easter.

In 2021, this will fall on Tuesday, 4th May. Making this change affirms the desire of the Church to put survivors at the heart of the response to abuse. Holding the day in Easter Season also offers the hope that Pope Francis spoke of in his first General Audience: "He healed, comforted, understood - gave hope. He led all to the presence of God." (27th March 2013). The 'Let's be Honest Group', a group set up to support survivor-centred initiatives such as this, has been asked to provide resources and prayers for the day. These will be published in due course. The group has already released a resource this Lent called 'Listening with Love' - inviting people to reflect on the impact of abuse on individuals and the Church. #### **VACANCY - FOUNDATION GOVERNOR**

At Blessed Hugh Faringdon Catholic School. Closing Date for applications: 7<sup>th</sup> June 2021. A vacancy for Foundation Governor on the governing body has arisen and expressions of interests are

being sought from practising committed Catholics for the ministry. The term of office is for four years from the date of appointment. Foundation Governors are personally appointed by Bishop Philip, Bishop of Portsmouth to diocesan schools to represent his interests and those of the Catholic community as a whole. The governors of a Catholic school work as a team, in close co-operation with the headteacher and all the staff. Foundation governors share the responsibilities of all governors:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction:
- Holding the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils, and the performance management of staff; and
- Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

In addition to this, foundation governors are appointed specifically to ensure:

- that the religious character of the school is preserved
- that the school is conducted in accordance with its trust deed
- that the religious education curriculum is in accordance with the Bishop's policy for this Diocese.

The school would benefit from people with skills or experience in one or more of the following: accountancy, legal, contracts, project/facilities management, quantity surveying. Anyone interested in the mission of foundation governor should not be put off by a lack of experience. Appropriate training is available during the period of service. # SAINT OF THE WEEK: THE ENGLISH MARTYRS - 4TH MAY

Many years ago, I watched an edition of Songs of Praise. I don't normally watch this programme but, as the theme that particular Sunday was "traditional Catholic hymns", I decided to tune in. One hymn was introduced as "the most Catholic of all Catholic hymns", namely Faith of Our Fathers, [sadly very rarely sung in our churches these days]. It was written in 1849 by Frederick William Faber (1814 -1863), a convert to Catholicism, in memory of the Catholic martyrs of this country who suffered for their faith between 1535 and 1680, and whose feast we celebrate on Tuesday.

On 4th May 1535, in Tyburn (close to the current location of Marble Arch), three Carthusian monks were the first of many men and women who were martyred for their faith during The Reformation. The number who died, who came from every walk of life, cannot be measured, however 284 of them have been canonised or declared blessed.

It wasn't just priests and religious who were martyred. Laity who were prepared to shelter priests; to arrange Masses in secret to witness to the faith, all met the same fate. They are remembered for the example they gave and for their courage in the face of persecution" in spite of dungeon, fire and sword", as the hymn puts it. Their heroic witness should help us have a greater love for the Church, the Mass and the holy priesthood. Let us pray for the priests and people of our neighbouring parish, a parish that we were part of until April 1966, when St Joseph's became a parish in its own right. *Mike Tomas*.



# ACT NOW AND STOP DISABILITY ABORTION UP TO BIRTH IN NORTHERN IRELAND

Earlier this year, the Northern Ireland Assembly voted on the Severe Fetal Impairment Abortion (Amendment) Bill, and it passed Second Stage by 48 votes to 12. The Northern Ireland Health Committee is now undertaking a consultation on the Bill and is seeking submissions from the public. It is important that as many people as possible submit to the consultation in support of the Bill to clearly show that there is widespread support for this important change.
