Dear Parishioners,

Many thanks for your continued generous donations of tinned food and clothing. They are much appreciated by the 72 homeless adults whom CIRDIC supports. We will continue to organize collections, on the first Saturday of every month, in the church car park, from 2 – 3 pm. The next collection will be on 6th February.

I would like to take this opportunity to report on SVP's other activities: In addition to the tinned food and clothing which you donate, SVP also spends around £2,600, annually, regularly supplying CIRDIC with fruit, vegetables, dairy and meat products. Beyond supporting CIRDIC, we also spend around £1,000 annually supporting Launch Pad, another Reading charity, supporting SVP India and SVP Sudan, our twin charities, and supporting the needs of our elderly parishioners. These are all really good, deserving causes.

We realize that these are financially difficult times for many people, and we do appreciate any donations you can provide to support what we do. SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST BLAISE - 3RD FEBRUARY

"Through the Intercession of St Blaise, Bishop and Martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every illness besides, in the Name of the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit. Amen". These, or similar words, are recited by the priest either during or after Mass on the Feast of St Blaise, when he individually blesses the throats of those present. Sadly, for obvious reasons, not this year. Two candles, blessed the previous day, Candlemas Day - the Feast of the Presentation of Our Lord, are tied together with ribbon in the form of an X. The candles are then held around the person's throat as the above prayer is recited. Devotions, such as the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday; kissing the cross on Good Friday and the blessing of the throats on St Blaise's Day, are all part of our Catholic lineage; we know that Catholics everywhere will be doing the same as us on these days.

St Blaise died in 316 (the date of his birth is not known), and was a bishop and physician, in what is now modern-day Turkey. He was arrested for being a Christian and, as he was being marched off to jail, encountered a young boy who was choking on a fish bone. Blaise touched the boy's throat and he was cured immediately. Whilst in prison, Blaise was given the opportunity to renounce his faith, which he refused to do. Blaise's body was flayed with iron combs (usually used to card wool), and was beheaded. I don't know why, but "The Bishop Blaise" (or Blaize) was a popular pub name in the Midlands and the North. The most well-known one is in Old Trafford, just by Manchester United's ground.

St Blaise, Patron Saint of those who suffer from any illness of the throat - *pray for us*. Mike Tomas.
