#### ST CECILIA, PATRON OF SINGERS AND MUSICIANS

Next Monday, 22<sup>nd</sup> November is the Memorial of St Cecilia, Virgin and Martyr (second or third century). Cecilia is said to have come from of wealthy Roman family, who gave her in marriage to a young nobleman called Valerian. She, however, wished to remain a virgin and on their wedding night she persuaded her husband to respect her vow of virginity, and later he converted to Christianity. During a period of persecution, Cecilia was arrested for having buried the bodies of the Christian dead, and for this was given the choice of sacrificing to the heathen gods or being put to death. She affirmed her faith and chose to die rather than renounce it. She was executed by beheading, but due to a loss of courage at having to kill such a young and beautiful woman, he failed to sever her head with the three blows required by law. Cecilia lay on the ground, still alive, lying on her right side, her hands crossed in prayer. She turned her face to the floor and prayed, with three fingers extended on her right hand and one on the left – a final and silent profession of faith in the Holy Trinity. The early Christians clothed her body in rich robes of silk and gold and placed it in a coffin in the same position in which she had expired. She was laid to rest in the Catacomb of St Callixtus, where her tomb can still be visited today. In the vear 822, Pope Pascal I transferred her remains to a new church built in her honour in Trastevere. The Basilica of St Cecilia is believed to have been built on the site of St. Cecilia's family mansion. The sculpture on her tomb in the catacombs was fashioned by Stefano Maderno, and is one of the most celebrated and best-known Italian works of art. Her status as patron of music and musicians, dates from the 16<sup>th</sup> century, and is based on the account of her wedding day, when instead of listening to the festive music, Cecilia sat apart and "sang in her heart to the Lord." So, next Monday, let us say a prayer for all our musicians, choirs, instrumentalists and organists, grateful to them for all they do to enhance the beauty of the Church's Liturgy.

#### **ADVENT IS COMING!**

Next Sunday, 28th November, is the First Sunday of Advent, when the Church enters into a short but magical season that prepares us for the Coming of Christ. Advent has a twofold character: as a season to prepare for Christmas when Christ's first coming to us in Bethlehem is remembered, and as a season when that remembrance directs the mind and heart to await Christ's second coming at the end of time. Advent is thus a period of hope, of devout and joyful expectation. At Sunday Mass, the Gospel readings each have a distinctive theme: the Lord's coming at the end of time (First Sunday of Advent), John the Baptist (Second and Third Sunday), and the events that prepared immediately for the Lord's birth (Fourth Sunday). The Old Testament readings are prophecies about the Messiah and the Messianic age, especially from the Isaiah. On weekdays, there are two series of readings: one to be used from the beginning of Advent until 16th December, the other from 17th – 24th December. In the first part of Advent, there are readings from Isaiah, distributed in accord with the sequence of the book itself, and including those texts that are also read on the Sundays. In "late Advent," the last week before Christmas, the events that immediately prepared for the Lord's birth are presented from Matthew and Luke.

Advent is a busy period, not least with writing cards and preparing for Christmas. The challenge is to find time for prayer and reflection. Why not start planning now so as to find time to keep a sense of true perspective during the holy season and thus be able to find from the Lord much joy and happiness.
