## **STATIONS OF THE CROSS ON GOOD FRIDAY**

#### **CHRISM MASS**

Fr Richard has kindly agreed to celebrate our 12 noon Mass next Tuesday, 12<sup>th</sup> April, whilst I attend the Chrism Mass of Oils at 11 am. Please join online. The Mass takes place in the Cathedral and is one of the main diocesan events of the year. The Mass is the special Liturgy in Holy Week during which the bishop blesses the three Holy Oils for use in the Sacraments: The Oil of the Blessing of the Sick, the Oil of Catechumens and the Oil of Chrism. The blessing of the Holy Oils is one of the most ancient ceremonies of the Church and it's always celebrated in the Cathedral with the priests, deacons, religious and lay people of the diocese. During it, all the priests make a renewal of their commitment to priestly service. It is always a wonderful manifestation of the Church in our Diocese of Portsmouth and an opportunity to thank God for our Catholic faith.

### **40 DAYS FOR LIFE**

Dear friends, As in previous campaigns, we would like to conclude our 40 Days for Life campaign with a candlelit vigil event on the last day and last hour of the campaign, that is, on Palm Sunday, 10th April, from 7 - 8 pm. The usual main intentions: Conversions of hearts and minds of those seeking, facilitating or encouraging abortions, Closure of the BPAS Reading abortuary, an end to DIY Home abortion, that women who have had abortions may repent and obtain God's forgiveness and healing.

As last time, I would like us to form a single line of prayer volunteers on either side of London Street from the junction with the London Road. We ask that you position yourselves 1 - 2m apart from each other and hold a placard (collect one from one of our stewards). Why not also bring and hold a candle while praying *quietly for the one-hour duration? During this vigil we* should take care to not obstruct passers-by, nor engage in any noisy or disruptive activities or arguments, but pray quietly throughout. PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

Palm Sunday is the beginning of Holy Week, the most important week of the year - the week that changed the world! With Holy Week we have reached the climax of the liturgical year, the highest peak of salvation history, when all that has been anticipated and promised is to be fulfilled. By the close of today's long Passion Gospel, the work of our redemption will have been accomplished, the new covenant will be written in the blood of His broken body hanging on the Cross at the place called the Skull.
