## PENTECOST SUNDAY – 23<sup>RD</sup> MAY 2021

### SPECIAL PRAYERS FOR OUR CONFIRMATION CANDIDATES

## Society for the Protection of Unborn Children

### ANNUAL APPEAL

We have deferred SPUC's White Flower appeal from earlier in the year to the weekend of 29/30<sup>th</sup> May 2021. In March 2020, the government introduced 'home abortion' under cover of emergency coronavirus

regulations. This allows women to take abortion pills at home without medical supervision, and is leading to more innocent babies being killed. There are serious dangers for the mothers too in that the drugs can lead to serious medical complications. Moving abortion from a clinic into the home also makes women much more vulnerable to coercion from abusive partners and family members. Moreover, the home becomes a place of loss. Despite the obstacles put in our way by Covid-19 regulations, we are continuing to spread the truth about abortion, and about the wonder of human life. You can help us in our current campaign by signing a postcard which asks the Prime Minister not to make home abortion permanent. The postcards are available on the exit table in church, to take away and fill in. You can return them to the collection basket, duly signed, when you next come to church, or stamp and post them. #### ACT NOW AND STOP DISABILITY ABORTION UP TO BIRTH IN NORTHERN IRELAND

Earlier this year, the Northern Ireland Assembly voted on the Severe Fetal Impairment Abortion (Amendment) Bill, and it passed Second Stage by 48 votes to 12. The Northern Ireland Health Committee is now undertaking a consultation on the Bill and is seeking submissions from the public. It is important that as many people as possible submit to the consultation in support of the Bill to clearly show that there is widespread support for this important change. ## **VACANCY - FOUNDATION GOVERNOR**

At Blessed Hugh Faringdon Catholic School. Closing Date for applications: 7<sup>th</sup> June 2021. A vacancy for Foundation Governor on the governing

body has arisen and expressions of interests are being sought from practising committed Catholics for the ministry. The term of office is for four years from the date of appointment. Foundation Governors are personally appointed by Bishop Philip, Bishop of Portsmouth to diocesan schools to represent his interests and those of the Catholic community as a whole. The governors of a Catholic school work as a team, in close co-operation with the headteacher and all the staff. Foundation governors share the responsibilities of all governors:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction;
- Holding the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils, and the performance management of staff; and
- Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

In addition to this, foundation governors are appointed specifically to ensure:

- that the religious character of the school is preserved
- that the school is conducted in accordance with its trust deed
- that the religious education curriculum is in accordance with the Bishop's policy for this Diocese.

The school would benefit from people with skills or experience in one or more of the following: accountancy, legal, contracts, project/facilities management, quantity surveying. Anyone interested in the mission of foundation governor should not be put off by a lack of experience.

**SAINT OF THE WEEK:  
ST BEDE - 25<sup>TH</sup> MAY (673 - 735)**

Doctor of the Church is a title bestowed by the Pope to saints recognised as having made a significant contribution to doctrine or theology through their research, writing or study. At present, there are thirty-six Doctors and of these, only one is English - St Bede - whose feast we celebrate on Tuesday.

Lockdown would not have affected St Bede if he lived today. A monk, he was born and died in Jarrow (in present-day Tyne and Wear), and rarely left the town's monastery.

Bede spent all his life devoting himself to the study of Scripture and was considered one of the most learned men of his time. He wrote many books; his most famous was "Historia Ecclesiastica Gentis Anglorum"- an Ecclesiastical History of the English Church and People which he completed in 731.

To recognise his wisdom, Bede was called "the Venerable", a title that was formally recognised at the Council of Aachen in 853. He is also credited with helping to popularise dating events Anno Domini [A.D.] and was one of the first, if not the first, to do so.

Bede died on 25<sup>th</sup> May 735 and his tomb is in the Galilee Chapel at the west end of Durham Cathedral.

In 1899, Pope Leo XIII declared Bede a Doctor of the Church.

There are many famous quotations attributed to St Bede, one of which is: "Unfurl the sails, and let God steer us where He will".

In Basingstoke, there is a Catholic Church dedicated to St Bede - let us pray for the priests and parishioners as they celebrate their feast day. **St Bede, Priest and Doctor of the Church - pray for us.**
