Dear Parishioners,

Many, many thanks for your continued generous donations of tinned food and clothing. They are much appreciated by the 72 homeless adults whom CIRDIC supports. We will continue to organize collections, on the first Saturday of every month, in the church car park, from 2-3 pm. The next collection will be on 6^{th} February.

I would like to take this opportunity to report on SVP's other activities: In addition to the tinned food and clothing which you donate, SVP also spends around £2,600, annually, regularly supplying CIRDIC with fruit, vegetables, dairy and meat products. Beyond supporting CIRDIC, we also spend around £1,000 annually supporting Launch Pad, another Reading charity, supporting SVP India and SVP Sudan, our twin charities, and supporting the needs of our elderly parishioners. These are all really good, deserving causes.

We realize that these are financially difficult times for many people, and we do appreciate any donations you can provide to support what we do. HELPING HAND - MAKING EVERY CONTACT COUNT - FOR BEFRIENDERS AND VOLUNTEERS

Starts 27th January from 12 noon – 1 pm via Zoom - 4 Week Course. Delegates will receive a MECC trained Certificate, on completion. Bookings: *Mauricha.White@reading.gov.uk*. The course is aimed at those who support older or vulnerable adults, in person or by telephone, who may be experiencing health related issues since COVID-19. The course is a 4-week, interactive, 1-hour session. We will work through effective conversation skills, to help the volunteers overcome barriers, and support the individual to identify their own health and wellbeing goals, ahead of the reopening of society.

FORMATION FOR READERS

During the 2020 lockdown we have been able to form about 100 readers over two sets of online workshops in October and November, offering a reading practice to each one with a Diocesan Listener. He will be discussing his recent discovery of the remains of a first-century house in Nazareth and his knowledge of the wider region. He is a University of Reading-based archaeologist whose other studies include Early Christian sites in Britain and Roman survivals at Hagia Sophia in Istanbul.

SAINT OF THE WEEK ST AGNES 21ST JANUARY

St Agnes was only twelve when she died in 304, and is one of the first women to be venerated by the Catholic Church. She came from a noble Roman family. Agnes was very beautiful and had many admirers who wanted to marry her. There was one young man in particular, the son of a Roman official, who wanted to marry her. Agnes refused declaring herself committed to Christ. This was at a time when Christianity was still an underground religion. refusal led to her death; she was stabbed in the throat. She is buried in a catacomb on the Via Nomentana (an ancient Roman road leading north-east out of the city), on land which it is believed her parents owned. Her grave became a great pilgrimage site for many years after her death.

In art, she is often depicted carrying a lamb. A lamb is the symbol of purity and also a play on her name, Agnus being the Latin for lamb. The first Eucharistic Prayer, also known as the Roman Canon, includes Agnes's name. St Agnes - pray for us. *Mike Tomas*.
