#### PILGRIMAGE TO MEDIUGORIE

If you would like to consider travelling to Medjugorje as a parish, please add your name and telephone number to Fr list. Details are set out 16th - 25th September 2020 - 9 nights. Accommodation is based on bed, breakfast and evening meal. All rooms are ensuite and air conditioned. Tariff: Single occupancy: 35 Euros per night = 315 Euros per person. Shared occupancy: 25 Euros per night = 225 Euros per person. (Note: any possible increase on these rates in due course will be very minimal). Also, there will be an additional total return payment of 40 Euros per person for coach transfers between the airport and Medjugorje. Flight details: Outbound: BA0842 LHR - SPLIT (Terminal 5) departing at 13.35 – 16th September 2020. Return: BA0843 SPLIT - LHR (Terminal 5) departing at 14.20 - 25th September 2020.

#### **LENT 2020**

Traditionally, Lent has been a time when we give up something we enjoy: biscuits, sweets or alcohol, for example. However, Lent is about self-discipline. Self-discipline doesn't have to be "giving something up", it can take the form of "doing something extra". During Lent last year, Fr Peter introduced a 6.30 am Mass on Wednesday mornings, giving us all the opportunity to practise self-discipline - to do something extra. The first of these Masses will be on 4th March and the last will be on 1st April (there will not be one in Holy Week). This Holy Season of Lent, why not give it a go? It really is good for the soul.

## THE RE-DEDICATION OF ENGLAND AS THE DOWRY OF MARY – "BEHOLD"

This Re-dedication on March 29th is both a personal promise by the people of England, and a renewal of the entrustment vows made by King Richard II in Westminster Abbey in 1381. England received the title 'Mary's Dowry' when Richard sought Our Lady's protection in the face of great political turmoil. This meant England was 'set aside' as a gift for Our Lady under her guidance and protection. On Sunday, 29th March at 12 noon, the Re-dedication will take place throughout the country. Like King Richard we are invited to give ourselves, the people of this country, as a gift to Mary. We can respond in two ways; making a personal pledge (the "Angelus Promise" in which we proclaim our union with Mary through the words of the Annunciation) and a communal entrustment (a prayer of profoundly historic and spiritual nature, bringing together the prayers of surrender and dedication that have echoed throughout our history). ## SUNDAY, 1ST MARCH 2020 DAY OF PRAYER & REPARATION FOR THE SINS OF SEXUAL ABUSE

Bishop Philip writes: I'd like to invite the whole Diocese to join me at the Cathedral on the First Sunday of Lent, 1st March 2020 for a Day of Prayer and Reparation for the sins of sexual abuse by members of the Church. I will lead the the Cathedral clergy, with assisted Fr Dominic Allain and Antonia Moffat of the organisation From Grief to Grace. The purpose is to beg God's forgiveness and healing and make reparation for the sins and crimes of sexual abuse that have taken place within the Church by and against its own members, especially children and vulnerable adults. As we begin the season of Lent, and especially during this two-year period of intense prayer for the spiritual renewal of our Diocese, it seems very important that we all have an opportunity to pray earnestly for the victims of sexual abuse and for the forgiveness of those people, clerical and lay, who have perpetrated abuse. We can feel heavily tarnished by the sins of the few and this weight of shame and guilt impairs and even imperils the Church's mission, or at least our ability serenely and joyfully to communicate the Good News of Christ. The Day will comprise prayers, talks, Rosary and devotions, woven around the Cathedral's usual Sunday Mass schedule. I will preach at all the morning Masses. The Day culminates with an afternoon Communal Act of Repentance and Atonement. More details in the next few weeks. All are welcome.
