## THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD - SUNDAY, 5TH JANUARY 2020

Wise Men, Magi, Three Kings, Astrologers or Astronomers – who knows exactly what these men were who arrived 'from the east' to pay homage to the new-born child. There are plenty of theories about who they were and where they came from, but to get hung up on these details is to miss the point as far as the Gospel story is concerned. Right at the very beginning of Christ's life on earth, people are drawn to his presence to worship Him, just as the prophecy in Isaiah foretells.

First come representatives of the Jewish people – the shepherds on whom the brightness of heaven had shone to direct their way. Then, some time later, come representatives of nations far away and with different cultures and religions. They too are given a sign, and a guide: the star. This was a sign which was significant in their own culture, for God always starts leading us from where we are at the moment; he will use all kinds of incidents and experiences we are naturally involved with in order to draw us to Himself.

At the beginning of another year, we can look forward with hope because of our faith in Jesus Christ. What we cannot know are the challenges and maybe tough situations we will need to face during the twelve months ahead. There will be lots of good – new relationships, the birth of babies, young people branching out and embracing new opportunities, new jobs and promotions. All of which provide ways for us to grow and 'live life to the full'. And, yes, mixed in with those there will be times of sadness, of loss, of coming to terms with things we would rather not face. But in all of it, we are never ever alone because 'God-is-with-us'. This is why he came and why he beckons us to draw closer. Don't gaze from a distance at the child in the manger – come closer and allow Him to take and hold your hand as you walk through this year.

May I take this opportunity of wishing you all a Happy and Holy New Year and may you all receive many blessings from the Good Lord in the year ahead. *Fr Peter.*

Many people like to book their holidays well in advance; if you would like to consider travelling to Medjugorje as a parish, please add your name and telephone number to Fr Peter's list. Details are set out below:

16th - 25th September 2020 - 9 nights. Accommodation is based on bed, breakfast and evening meal. All rooms are en-suite and air conditioned. Tariff: Single occupancy: 35 Euros per night = 315 Euros per person. Shared occupancy: 25 Euros per night = 225 Euros per person. (Note: any possible increase on these rates in due course will be very minimal). Also, there will be an additional total return payment of 40 Euros per person for coach transfers between the airport and Medjugorje.
