### **RIGHT TO LIFE UK**

Ask your MP to sign a parliamentary motion calling on the Government to introduce new guidance on fetal pain. A new parliamentary motion (EDM 1340) is calling on the Government to introduce new guidance on fetal pain. The evidence that babies can feel pain in the womb, and during many abortions, highlights the humanity of the unborn child, and provides another important reason to introduce legislation to protect the unborn child from abortion.

Right To Life UK has set up an easy-to-use tool which makes it simple to contact your MP, and ask them to sign this motion, calling on the Government to introduce new guidance on fetal pain. There is extensive evidence that many women in the Uyghur Muslim community in Xinjiang, China are being subjected to forced abortions.

Lord Alton is currently championing an amendment to the Trade Bill which would give British courts a role in determining whether a country is committing genocide. This would help with putting international pressure on the Chinese Communist Party to stop the practice of forcing abortions on the Uyghur Muslim community along with the wider human rights abuses that evidence shows is being perpetuated against this community. Dear Parishioners,

Many thanks for your continued generous donations of tinned food and clothing. They are much appreciated by the 72 homeless adults whom CIRDIC supports. The Department of Health is holding a public consultation on whether to continue the practice of allowing abortion providers to send abortion pills to women so that they can perform their own abortion at home. ### SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST POLYCARP - FEBRUARY 23<sup>RD</sup>

St Polycarp, who died in 155, was converted to Christianity by St John the Evangelist, so he was fortunate enough to be instructed by someone who had first-hand knowledge of Jesus. He later became the Bishop of Smyrna, which is now Izmir in Turkey.

When he was an old man, he was urged by the Roman proconsul to renounce Christ, in order to save his life. Polycarp's response was: "For eighty-six years, I have served him, and he has never wronged me. How can I renounce the King who has saved me?

Polycarp was stabbed to death, and his body burnt. His final words were: "I bless you Father for judging me worthy of this hour, so that in the company of the martyrs, I may share the cup of Christ". His followers collected his relics and wrote an account of his life and martyrdom. The guarded relics can be found in the church of Sant' Ambrogio della Massima in Rome.

St Polycarp is the patron saint of people with earaches, because he often preached that he would rather be deaf than hear heretical doctrines.

Interestingly, the Catholic school in Farnham, Surrey, is dedicated to St Polycarp. Writing this in half term, I am unable to ask the school why he was chosen as their patron. I shall try and find out when they are back. *St Polycarp - pray for us.* Mike Tomas.
