RICHARD DAVIS RIP

It is with great sadness that we report the death of Richard Davis, former parishioner of St Joseph's, who died of a heart attack at the age of 80, on 25th February 2021, after 6 weeks in hospital.

Richard and his family came to Tilehurst in 1972. He was a prominent contributor to the parish, before his move in 1990 to English Martyrs. During his time with us, Richard achieved two significant results. He produced the first set of annual accounts for St Joseph's for Fr Kelleher, for submission to the diocese. He was the first person to take on the Chairman of Governors' role at St Paul's School, following Fr Kelleher's extended period as Chairman of Governors. In both capacities, Richard enjoyed the full trust and confidence of Fr Kelleher as he began preparing for his eventual retirement from the parish, as well as having the knowledge and expertise, as a NatWest Bank Manager, to handle both roles. In practical terms, Richard was a one-man Finance Committee; for some time, the predecessor of the current Finance Committee, set up by Fr Peter Codd in 2000. The Parish has much to be grateful for.

The thoughts and prayers of St Joseph's parishioners are extended to Sheila, Richard's wife, to Mark and to Teresa, their children and families.
May Richard rest in peace.

The funeral at English Martyrs is yet to be announced.

THE FEAST OF ST JOSEPH – 19TH MARCH

We will celebrate the Feast of St Joseph at 10 am Mass next Friday, 19th March. There is no need to book to attend this Mass, but you MUST already be registered to attend Mass with us. The stewards will check names as people arrive. No invitations will be sent for this Mass so registered people can just turn up to see if there are still any spare places. Our normal seating restrictions will apply - one household or 2 singles per bench. This Mass will be livestreamed especially for parishioners and St Paul's School, so that everyone can witness the blessing of their school ties.

Although statues depict St Joseph as an old man, he was probably quite young when God chose him to be the husband of the Virgin Mary and foster father of Jesus.

The Gospels do not tell us much about him; indeed, not a single word of his is recorded in Sacred Scripture. Nevertheless, we are told enough to enable us to see with what faithfulness, selflessness and love, Joseph responded to his extraordinary vocation, and carried out his difficult tasks.

In his Apostolic Letter "Patris Corde" (with a Father's Heart) Pope Francis recalls the 150th anniversary of the Declaration of St Joseph as patron of the Universal Church. To mark the occasion, the Holy Father proclaimed a "Year of Joseph", which began on 8th December - the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception.

Pope Francis describes St Joseph as "a beloved Father; a tender and loving Father; an obedient Father; an accepting Father; a Father who is creatively courageous; a working Father; a Father in the shadows".

When did St Joseph die? The bible does not record his death, but based on Gospel narrative, it was probably when Jesus was somewhere between 12 - 30 years old. When Jesus was twelve the Holy Family went to Jerusalem together. However, at the start of Jesus's public ministry, Joseph is notably absent. We read that before he died, Jesus said to St John: "This is your mother", and from that moment the disciple made a place for her in his home. Jesus wouldn't have said what he did if Joseph was still alive.

SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST PATRICK - 17TH MARCH

St Patrick's Day is the most celebrated Saints' Day in the world. By the word "celebrated", I don't mean in the religious sense, I mean in the commercial sense.

Sadly, if you went into any pub on St Patrick's Day and asked any man with a pint of Guinness in his hand to name five things about St Patrick, he would struggle to answer you.

It's hard to believe now, but up until the 1970's, Irish Law prohibited pubs opening on 17th March, as a mark of respect for this religious day. St Patrick's Day always falls in Lent, and it was feared that the pubs being open would be too tempting for those off the beer for Lent, leading to an increase in drunkenness on what is a Holy Day of Obligation there. Before the drinking ban was repealed, there was only one place where you could buy a drink on 17th March, and that was at the Royal Dublin Dog Show. Judging by the number of people who turned up every year, it is not just the British who are a nation of dog lovers.

St Patrick was born in 385. He wasn't Irish, but his place of birth is uncertain. At the age of sixteen, he was captured by raiders and taken to Ireland as a slave. After six years, he escaped and returned home.

If we look at his writings, we find that he believed that his enslavement was a result of his lack of faith during his younger years. His faith deepened whilst in Ireland, which led him to study for the priesthood on his return.

Around the year 432, he felt a compulsion to spread the Word of God to the people of Ireland, and returned as a missionary bishop. His symbol is the shamrock, because it is said that he used the three leaves of this plant to explain the Trinity.

He died on 17th March 461, and his stature grew as the person who brought Christianity to the people of Ireland. *St Patrick - pray for us.*

FOUNDATION GOVERNOR VACANCY

St Paul's Catholic Primary School is actively looking for two Foundation Governors to join our Governing Board. You must be a practising Catholic and willing to commit to a term of office of four years from the date of appointment. Foundation Governors are personally appointed by Bishop Philip, Bishop of Portsmouth to diocesan schools to represent his interests and those of the Catholic community as a whole. The governors of a school work as a team, in close co-operation with the headteacher and all the staff. As a Foundation Governor you will share the responsibilities of all governors:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction.
- Holding the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils, and the performance management of staff; and
- Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

In addition to this, Foundation Governors are appointed specifically to ensure:

- that the religious character of the school is preserved
- that the school is conducted in accordance with its trust deed
- that the religious education curriculum is in accordance with the Bishop's policy for this Diocese

To deliver the best for our pupils, staff, parents/carers and whole community, we need a full complement of governors. To operate effectively, a governing board must have governors with a variety of skills who are willing to share ideas and workload, and provide support and challenge in equal measure. We are looking for practising committed Catholics with the time and enthusiasm to be a school governor and to work with a strong established team to support our school and enrich our children's educational experience.
