

ANNUAL APPEAL

We have deferred SPUC's White Flower appeal from earlier in the year to **this** weekend. In March 2020, the government

introduced 'home abortion' under cover of emergency coronavirus regulations. This allows women to take abortion pills at home without medical supervision, and is leading to more innocent babies being killed. There are serious dangers for the mothers too in that the drugs can lead to serious medical complications. Moving abortion from a clinic into the home also makes women much more vulnerable to coercion from abusive partners and family members. Moreover, the home becomes a place of loss. Despite the obstacles put in our way by Covid-19 regulations, we are continuing to spread the truth about abortion, and about the wonder of human life. You can help us in our current campaign by signing a postcard which asks the Prime Minister not to make home abortion permanent. The postcards are available on the exit table in church, to take away and fill in. You can return them to the collection basket, duly signed, when you next come to church, or stamp and post them. ACT NOW AND STOP DISABILITY ABORTION UP TO BIRTH IN NORTHERN IRELAND

Earlier this year, the Northern Ireland Assembly voted on the Severe Fetal Impairment Abortion (Amendment) Bill, and it passed Second Stage by 48 votes to 12. The Northern Ireland Health Committee is now undertaking a consultation on the Bill and is seeking submissions from the public. It is important that as many people as possible submit to the consultation in support of the Bill to clearly show that there is widespread support for this important change. SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST BONIFACE – 5TH JUNE

Anyone who has spent any time as a member of the University of Exeter's Catholic Society, whose building, just off campus, bears his name, will be very familiar with this week's featured saint, St Boniface. But despite his work, and the relatively rich documentary evidence for his life, his legacy sits somewhat in obscurity in comparison with other Anglo-Saxon saints such as Columba of Iona, Augustine of Canterbury, the Venerable Bede, and Cuthbert and Aidan of Lindisfarne.

Born in the late seventh century in or near the village of Crediton, seven miles north-west of Exeter, Boniface played a fundamental role in the conversion and evangelisation of the Germanic parts of the Frankish Empire (modern day northern-Germany and the Netherlands). Having undertaken extensive missionary work and founded churches, he was consecrated as Archbishop of Mainz by Pope Gregory III. The most famous story attributed to Boniface's missionary work is the so-called felling of the Donar, or Jupiter's, Oak near the town of Fritzlar, in Hesse. As Boniface began to chop down the tree, which was considered holy by the local Pagans, a gust of wind blew over the ancient tree. When the god did not strike Boniface down for this sacrilegious act, in their amazement, the Pagans converted to Christianity. The wood from the oak was used by Boniface to build a chapel to St Peter, which later became part of a monastery.

He was martyred in 742, having been attacked by robbers whilst on the road to meet a number of converts, and his remains were brought to the town of Fulda, also in Hesse, where his shrine remains a place of pilgrimage today. His UK National shrine is housed in the Catholic Church, named after him, in Crediton. He is venerated in the Catholic Church as the patron of Devon and Germany and within the Orthodox church, alongside Augustine and Cuthbert, on 5th June. *St Boniface - pray for us.* Dr Julia Tomas.
