A WARNING

Last week after the Friday evening Mass, a couple of parishioners were approached in the church car park by a young man who said he was homeless and had been sleeping in his car; he was accompanied by a young woman who he said was his sister. He was looking to contact members of the SVP as he had been advised that they were an organisation who might be able to help them. He was asking for £120 to pay a week's deposit on a room he had arranged to rent, and that without an address and a tenancy agreement he would be unable to start the job that he had lined up for the following week. He was polite and initially his story seemed plausible but, without going into all the details, the parishioners involved were fairly confident that this was a scam and no money changed hands. Eventually the couple drove off without any fuss and have made no further attempt to contact the SVP. Please be vigilant if you are approached in a similar way and do not hand over any money. Our SVP president, Jack Ewins, has advised that he will always talk to anyone experiencing difficulties and is happy for his mobile number to given out (0773 449 9190) but whilst providing practical help, the SVP do not give out cash.
