ASH WEDNESDAY - 17TH FEBRUARY

It is a day of fasting and abstinence, mandatory on both Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, when God calls us to repent with prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Due to the pandemic, ashes cannot be distributed in the usual way; instead, Fr Peter will sprinkle the ashes on the top of parishioners' heads. There will not be the usual visible sign on the forehead.

There will be two Masses celebrated at 11 am & 7 pm; both will be live streamed. The weekday 'walk-in' rule will NOT apply for Ash Wednesday. Please only attend if you have an invitation for the Mass. Spaces at the 11 am Mass have already been allocated to the parishioners who normally attend Mass on Wednesdays. Seats at the 7 pm Mass will be allocated on a first-come-first-served basis, to those who are registered. We understand that we do not have the capacity to fit everyone in who would like to come, and we are sorry that some of you will be disappointed. RIGHT TO LIFE UK

Ask your MP to sign a parliamentary motion calling on the Government to introduce new guidance on fetal pain. A new parliamentary motion (EDM 1340) is calling on the Government to introduce new guidance on fetal pain. The evidence that babies can feel pain in the womb, and during many abortions, highlights the humanity of the unborn child, and provides another important reason to introduce legislation to protect the unborn child from abortion.

Right To Life UK has set up an easy-to-use tool which makes it simple to contact your MP, and ask them to sign this motion, calling on the Government to introduce new guidance on fetal pain. It only takes 30 seconds using this easy-to-use tool. This tool can be accessed via www.righttolife.org.uk/FetalPainMotion.

There is extensive evidence that many women in the Uyghur Muslim community in Xinjiang, China are being subjected to forced abortions.

Lord Alton is currently championing an amendment to the Trade Bill which would give British courts a role in determining whether a country is committing genocide. This would help with putting international pressure on the Chinese Communist Party to stop the practice of forcing abortions on the Uyghur Muslim community along with the wider human rights abuses that evidence shows is being perpetuated against this community. Dear Parishioners.

Many thanks for your continued generous donations of tinned food and clothing. They are much appreciated by the 72 homeless adults whom CIRDIC supports. SAINT OF THE WEEK: THE SEVEN HOLY FOUNDERS OF THE SERVITE ORDER – 17TH FEBRUARY

Could you imagine seven of our male parishioners abandoning their families, friends and well-paid jobs to withdraw to the mountains as a group, to live an austere life of prayer, mortification, solitude and direct service to God? No, neither could I, but that is exactly what happened in Florence in the thirteenth century.

In Florence at that time, religion was virtually meaningless and plagued with heresies; these seven men, all of whom worked in the cloth trade, decided enough was enough, and withdrew to Monte Senario (just outside Florence), to devote themselves to Christ, meditating on His Passion, and venerating Our Lady of Sorrows, to whom they are dedicated.

They founded the Servants of Mary (Servite Friars), which received papal approval in 1304. It is the only Order that was founded by a group, rather than just an individual. As a group, they were canonized by Pope Leo XIII in 1888. Their feast day has changed twice: the latest change being in 1969, when it was moved to the present date, the anniversary of the death of Alexis Falconieri, one of the Founders, who died in 1310. There are two Servite priories in England; one in Fulham, the other in Kersal (Greater Manchester). In 1952, in London, Joan Bartlett founded the Servite Secular Institute. The Institute has since spread to various European countries and to North and South America. Members live and work as consecrated individuals wherever they Vowed to God, their first find themselves. obligation is to love and serve Him in all things and to give witness to God's love for all. In 1964, to the great joy of its founder, the Institute was granted Official Church Recognition.

Carmen, our sacristan, is a member of the Servite Secular Institute, and took her first vows here at St Joseph's on 8th December 1991, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception; let us pray for her on her special feast day. *Holy Founders of the Servite Order - pray for us.* Mike Tomas.
