ONLINE WORKSHOPS FOR READERS WITH 1:1 PRACTICE

Our Team is currently offering a couple of online workshops for parish readers:

CAFÉ THÉOLOGIOUE

Why Christians Need to Stop Evangelising (Badly) and Have a Conversation – Monday, 9th May, 7.30 – 9 pm, Zerodegrees Bar, Bridge Street.

James Butler asks: What if instead of seeing evangelism as a task to be done, we see it as a conversation to be entered into? James is assistant coordinator for Pioneer Mission Leadership Training for the Church Missionary Society. He is an MA lecturer who teaches in the areas of mission, ecclesiology and practical theology. His ongoing PhD research explores how small missional communities sustain their social action. He also works as a postdoctoral researcher at the University of Roehampton. In this session James Butler suggests that the ways we understand evangelism may actually be getting in the way of evangelism. Drawing on research he will show how training for evangelism can actually disable rather than enable people to share their faith. We can end up putting so much emphasis on the words we need to say that we miss the person in front of us. We can also miss how God is already at work in that person and the community. Café Théologique is hosted by the University of Reading Chaplaincy and is a space to explore contemporary issues from a theological perspective. All are welcome. SAINT OF THE WEEK: THE ENGLISH MARTYRS - 4TH MAY

One of the most traditional Catholic hymns is considered by many to be Faith of Our Fathers. It was written in 1849 by Frederick William Faber (1814 -1863), a convert to Catholicism, in memory of the Catholic martyrs of this country who suffered for their faith between 1535 and 1680, and whose feast we celebrate on Wednesday.

On 4th May 1535, in Tyburn (close to the current location of Marble Arch), three Carthusian monks were the first of many men and women who were martyred for their faith during The Reformation. The number who died, who came from every walk of life, cannot be measured, however 284 of them have been canonised or declared blessed.

It wasn't just priests and religious who were martyred. Laity who were prepared to shelter priests; to arrange Masses in secret to witness to the faith, all met the same fate. They are remembered for the example they gave and for their courage in the face of persecution "in spite of dungeon, fire and sword", as the hymn puts it. Their heroic witness should help us have a greater love for the Church, the Mass and the holy priesthood. Let us pray for the priests and people of our neighbouring parish, a parish that we were part of until April 1966, when St Joseph's became a parish in its own right.

All you holy English Martyrs - pray for us.
