#### **DAY OF PRAYER FOR VICTIMS AND SURVIVORS**

Tuesday, 4<sup>th</sup> May is to be this year's Day of Prayer for the Victims and Survivors of Abuse. Listening to the voices of victims and survivors, the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales have moved the date on which the Day of Prayer for the Victims and Survivors of Abuse is usually marked, to a new date during the Easter Season. Initially, the Fifth Friday in Lent, it was felt that the inclusion of this day in Lent was penitential. The original motivation for the day was not the Church seeking forgiveness for its failings, but on the hope and renewal that is necessary for the victims, survivors and others affected by abuse (for example families, parish communities). As such, the Conference decided to move this Day of Prayer for Victims and Survivors of Abuse to the Tuesday of the Fifth Week of Easter. In 2021, this will fall on Tuesday, 4th May. Making this change affirms the desire of the Church to put survivors at the heart of the response to abuse. Holding the day in Easter Season also offers the hope that Pope Francis spoke of in his first General Audience: "He healed, comforted, understood gave hope. He led all to the presence of God." (27th March 2013). The 'Let's be Honest Group', a group set up to support survivor-centred initiatives such as this, has been asked to provide resources and prayers for the day. These will be published in due course. The group has already released a resource this Lent called 'Listening with Love' - inviting people to reflect on the impact of abuse on individuals and the Church. #### **SAINT OF THE WEEK**

As every good English man and woman knows, the 23<sup>rd</sup> April marks Saint George's Day; a day raised to the celebration of Solemnity (highest class feast) in this country, in 2003.

George was martyred in Palestine in 303 for refusing to make a sacrifice in honour of pagan gods. He was canonized by Pope Gelasius I in 494, who said that George was among those "whose names are justly reverenced among men, but whose actions are known only to God". His tomb can be found in Lod, near Tel Aviv, Israel. George's reputation for holiness and virtue spread across Europe, and his feast day was first celebrated in this country in the 9th century. He was admired for his bravery in the face of terrible suffering, and he became popular among European Knights and military personnel.

It is said that King Edward III owned a relic of George's blood and had a great devotion to him, so much so that he appointed him patron saint of England in 1350. During the Middle Ages, George's protection was invoked against many fatal diseases such as leprosy and the Plague [maybe we could pray to him in this pandemic?]. In recent years, there have been many campaigns for St George's Day to be a public holiday. However, from the 13th century not only was St George's Day a national holiday, but was also a Holy Day. When the English Reformation severely curtailed the number of saints' days in the calendar, St George's Day continued to be observed. After the Union of England and Scotland at the end of the 18th century, devotion to St George decreased in popularity. St George is also patron saint of many other countries including Ethiopia, Georgia, Portugal and Russia. *St George, patron of England - pray for us.* Mike Tomas.
