Dear Parishioners,

Many, many thanks for your continued generous donations of tinned food and clothing. They are much appreciated by the 72 homeless adults whom CIRDIC supports. We will continue to organize collections, on the first Saturday of every month, in the church car park, from 2 - 3 pm. The next collection will be on 6<sup>th</sup> February.

I would like to take this opportunity to report on SVP's other activities: In addition to the tinned food and clothing which you donate, SVP also spends around £2,600, annually, regularly supplying CIRDIC with fruit, vegetables, dairy and meat products. #### SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST THOMAS AQUINAS 28TH JANUARY

St Thomas Aquinas (1225 - 1274), was an Italian Dominican friar, philosopher, priest and Doctor of the Church. "Aquinas" literally means" of Aquino", an area governing the place where Thomas was most likely to have been born. He is considered to be one of the Catholic Church's greatest theologians and philosophers. He was a prolific writer (he always wrote in Latin), and had a great devotion to the Blessed Sacrament which most of his writings reflect.

On Maundy Thursday, as the Blessed Sacrament is taken to the Altar of Repose, we sing the Pange Lingua; this hymn was composed by St Thomas Aquinas. The last stanza of this hymn is the Tantum Ergo, which together with O Salutaris Hostia and Godhead Here in Hiding (also composed by him), are hymns sung when Benediction was the norm on Sunday evenings in practically every Catholic Church.

On the feast of Corpus Christi, after the Second Reading, we recite the Sequence, the Lauda Sion. Pope Urban IV asked Thomas Aquinas to compose a prayer for the new feast that was instituted in 1264. We have been saying this prayer ever since, albeit lately, in a shorter form.

His greatest work, Summa Theologica (Summary of Theology), is still widely used as part of theological studies.

Pope Leo XIII declared him Patron Saint of Catholic schools. I wonder how many Headteachers and Governors know this? His feast day was originally 7<sup>th</sup> March, the day he died. However, in 1969 when the calendar was revised, it was transferred to its present day. *St Thomas Aquinas - pray for us.* Mike Tomas.
