## THIRTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME – 27<sup>TH</sup> JUNE 2021

Today, is the Thirteenth Sunday of the Year and the Gospel is Mark 5:21-43. This Sunday's Gospel presents us with two miracles of Jesus: his healing of the woman with haemorrhage, and his raising up the daughter of Jairus. We see a great contrast between the hidden and discreet faith of the woman who simply touches his garment in the hope that he will heal her, and the faithlessness of Jairus' household who tell him not to bother asking Jesus to raise her from the dead. Can Jesus do both? Can Jesus do everything? If so, why does it often feel like he is doing . . . . . nothing? Perhaps he simply wants us to grow in faith in his multitasking abilities . . . . . ## SAINT OF THE WEEK: SS PETER AND PAUL – 29<sup>TH</sup> JUNE

- 1. Since very early times, the Church has joined Saints Peter and Paul in one Solemnity. They were both martyred in Rome in the year 64. Records do not show if one or both were martyred on 29<sup>th</sup> June. However, after 2000 years, they are still our fathers in faith.
- 2. As Saint Paul had Roman citizenship, he was given the more "merciful" death of being beheaded. St Peter was crucified and, at his request, upside down. He felt unworthy to die in the same manner as Christ.
- 3. Before becoming followers of Christ, Peter, we know, was a fisherman; Paul was a tentmaker.
- 4. Paul was highly educated and an extensive writer having given us thirteen of the twenty-seven books of the New Testament. The two letters attributed to Peter were either dictated by him or written on his behalf. He ends his first Letter by saying: "I write these few words to you through Silvanus, who is a brother I know I can trust" (1Pet 5:12).
- 5. Despite being an uneducated fisherman, it was Peter who landed the top job; Paul was never Pope.
- 6. Rome has four basilicas: St Peter's is the most famous, but there is also one dedicated to St Paul. Known as St Paul's Outside the Walls, it houses portraits of every pope since St Peter.
- 7. SS Peter and Paul is a Holy Day of Obligation in England, Wales and Scotland, but not Ireland, America or surprisingly, Italy.
- 8. SS Peter and Paul is a Roman celebration only, both a religious Solemnity and a secular festival. At Mass on this day, various Archbishops are presented by the Pope with a pallium [a narrow circular band made of wool which has lappets front and back]. This is placed on the shoulders to symbolise the special relationship with the Pope and communion with the Church of Rome.
