THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (A) – 24TH/25TH OCTOBER 2020

Gospel Matthew 22:34-40

In today's Gospel Jesus says the greatest commandment is a twofold commandment of love: love of God and love of neighbour. He reminds his listeners that they themselves were once strangers in a foreign land and they must show justice and compassion to vulnerable people: those who are poor, strangers, disadvantaged. Generous love of neighbour is an indispensable means of loving God. Jesus expands the meaning of neighbour: the commandment to love includes those in our family and our community, along with elderly people, orphans, outsiders, impoverished people around the world, and even our enemies. In other words: everyone. The authenticity of our faith, our love of God and our relationship with Christ is measured by the way we treat others.

The readings challenge us to seek repentance and forgiveness for our negative attitudes towards others. The second reading suggests that we should abandon our idols – perhaps love of money, consumerism, celebrities – and make a conscious choice to love our neighbours. So many saints have expressed their love for God by seeking out the most wretched, the poorest, weakest members of society, loving them and raising them up, to reveal their intrinsic dignity as persons worthy of love.

How do we apply the law of love in our lives? What does it mean to love God and our neighbour in the world today? Can we broaden our concept of neighbour to include the wider world, particularly where basic needs are great? The love Jesus is talking about is more than warm feelings towards others. Charity is vital in our world, but it goes alongside speaking out, and acting on behalf of others. It means living simply, sharing our wealth, protecting our environment and investing our money ethically, so as not to exploit others.

Churches are a valuable resource to vulnerable people such as those who are homeless, migrants or refugees. Some churches provide facilities for an overnight stay in winter months. Some have arrangements with local authorities or businesses to provide food, and tea or coffee vouchers at local vendors. Some churches are in ecumenical networks running soup kitchens, health support, and asylum seeker support services. Participants often say how they have learnt from the engagement, and their understanding of "neighbour" has expanded. We are stewards of one another, and we are called to seek to love and pray for friend and enemy alike. A mission for waging peace over waging war at international level is also vital, especially as poor communities are often the first to be killed and maimed, or displaced from their homes in war. In God's kingdom, even enemies are treated as friends.

TRACK AND TRACE: QR CODE

BAMENDA SUNDAY

Forty-five years ago, the diocese of Bamenda and Portsmouth were twinned. Sadly, over the last few years there has been a steady deterioration in the socio/political situation between the Englishspeaking region of Cameroon (within which Bamenda sits), and the French speaking government. This has led to an escalating cycle of violence, resulting in deaths, villages being destroyed, and schools being closed. Many lives have been lost in the region. Please pray for peace and the repose of the souls of parishioners in Bamenda who have been killed in the conflict. In this crisis, the Bishops in Bamenda have been forthright in condemning the violence and killings.

BACK 2 BASICS

- SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION)

The FFM team have created an online group input that will help all adults wanting to know more about their faith, especially parents whose children are preparing for First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. We will be looking at this sacrament using artwork, group activities and discussion, and offer an introduction to Catholic morality, looking at topics such as the dignity of the human person, grace, sin, freedom, conscience, human happiness, and the call to holiness. SS SIMON AND JUDE – 28TH OCTOBER

Simon and Jude are Apostles who are briefly mentioned in the Gospel, and nothing is known of either of them with any certainty, not even where they evangelized, or where they met their death. They were probably martyred on the same day; hence the reason for sharing the same feast day.

Simon is referred to as the "Zealot" probably because of his zeal for Jewish law which he practised before being called by Jesus.

Judas Iscariot was not the only Judas amongst the twelve apostles. The other one, we now know as St Jude, in order that we do not confuse him with his contemporary.

A tradition gathered over the centuries of petitioning St Jude only when other saints had failed to intercede. He became the Patron Saint of Hopeless Causes, probably because of people's reluctance to seek the intercession of one who had the misfortune to have the same name as Christ's betrayer. Poor St Jude was the last resort!

Many centuries after their deaths, their bodies were placed in a crypt in St Peter's Basilica, under the main altar of St Joseph. Saints Simon and Jude pray for us. *Mike Tomas.*
