Now that the dark days of CoVid and all its restrictions are behind us, we must all now endeavour to consciously return to the practice of the time-honoured customs and traditions of our beautiful Catholic faith which are deserving of being preserved and passed onto future generations. I am referring specifically to the Eucharistic ritual of the 'Sign of Peace'.

The earliest description of the inclusion of this custom in the Mass goes as far back as 155 AD in the liturgy of St Justin Martyr, the second-century Church Father. "When we have completed the prayers, we salute one another with a kiss". "The kiss is a sign that our souls are united and that we have no remembrance of animus or ill-will". In today's liturgy of the Latin rite of the Roman Novus Ordo Mass, a 'Sign of Peace' offered in the form of a handshake extended to those in one's immediate proximity is This is the current considered appropriate. recommendation of the Catholic Bishops Conference of England and Wales (CBCEW). Brethren, changes to our criminal laws are planned. Labour MP Diana Johnson, has proposed an amendment to remove abortion entirely from the criminal law framework, which will remove all safeguards protecting both lives involved in pregnancy. Should the clause become law, it would become legal for a woman to choose to end her pregnancy at any stage up to full-term (birth). In addition to the obvious risk to the unborn and the complete disregard for the dignity of human life, this proposal ignores the significant potential risk of complications likely to be incurred by women seeking to procure dangerous late-term partial birth abortions.
