# **CAFOD BIG LENT WALK 2025**

Saturday, 8<sup>th</sup> March, 10 am starts at St Anne's, Caversham. Join your Reading Catholic community as Pilgrims of Hope raising funds for CAFOD. Father Joe will begin with a small Jubilee celebration. We will learn about the Holy door, and



fulfil an indulgence ingredient, followed by a period of prayer together at the Shrine of our Lady of Caversham. We will listen to an explanation from the Confraternity of St James of how the walk we are about to embark on ties into the pilgrimage route to Santiago de Compostela in Spain. We will pause at the Camino mural in Friar Street, walking onto Reading Abbey via St James, and then along the Kennet into beautiful countryside following the tow path, as far as the Cunning Man pub in Burghfield, or a shorter flood proof version will end at Christ the King in Whitley. The total time including regular stops for prayers of hope and hymns of joy will be 3 hours.
